Deuteronomy 34:1-12

Home Group Sermon

Introduction

This is the 5th in the current Home Group series on 'Mountain Top Experiences'. We come to Mount Nebo where we read in Deuteronomy 34: 4-6 that the Lord told Moses that he would '**see it**' but not cross over it. And Moses the servant of the Lord died there in Moab.

Moses climbs Mount Nebo and surveys the Promised Land. His prayer to see it is granted. He can die content that his mission is accomplished.

Moses dies at the age of 120. In Egypt, such an age would be attributed to a person of great distinction. The Bible also says,

"his eyes were not weak nor his strength gone".

A detail all the more significant given that he was able to climb Mount Nebo on his own. In the Bible his epitaph is even finer.

'Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face'. (34:10)

Moses - The Greatest Prophet!

No other prophet had the distinction of knowing God face-toface (Deuteronomy 34:10; see also Exodus 33:11). Moses was still regarded as Israel's greatest prophet; except to God in the signs and wonders and mighty deeds that he performed in the wilderness. (Deuteronomy 34:11; see also Exodus 6:1; 7:3). Yet even this great man was not allowed to enter the promised land. Whether or not Joshua will meet this standard in the eyes of the people is yet to be seen.

Moses was the greatest leader Israel ever had. Despite his sense of inadequacy, he accepted God's call to confront Pharaoh and head up the exodus. In a quiet, self-effacing way, he discerned God's will and made it known to others. He encountered ALL kinds of difficulty and discouragement during the trek across the desert – but met EVERY crisis with honest passion and unfailing **PRAYER**. His enduring achievement was that he received the revelation of God's law, and made every effort to record it, teach it and establish it for future generations.

Moses' Leadership

Moses' death comes after a forty-year journey in the wilderness when they had come to the plains of Moab. Although God promised to go before the Israelites on their sojourn to Canaan, if it were not for Moses' leadership and intercession on more than one occasion; the people would have been died. At last Moses sees the land he has for 40 years longed to enter. Israel sees him no more. ...but we meet him once again in Scripture – on a mountain, talking to the Lord. (Mark 9:2-4)

So as we follow Moses and hear how he survived and endured all that happened during this time; repeatedly we are told that he never lost HOPE in all that God had promised him. He PRAYED and TRUSTED GOD.

We are encouraged to hold onto HOPE, especially during those times when life is very difficult and hard, for whatever reason. Maybe all we can see before us is a big mountain to climb or go around. Life can be very tough at times. Personally, I can say without doubt that there have been times in my own life when all has seemed impossible. When I haven't been able to see a way forward – even as a Christian! There have been 'wilderness' times for me and HOPE has seemed beyond reach.

During those times it has always been very helpful to have trusted Christian friends who have supported me, encouraged me, been there for me. Homegroup has always been a very safe place for me. Over many years and in a few different Homegroups during my life here in Billericay, there have always been those who have guided me and sometimes just been alongside me to pray with me and enable me to find my way again. At times they have lovingly and prayerfully pointed out things that could be wrong and not the best that God would want of me. Trusted Christian friends have been invaluable to me that has often been a two-way thing.

The Bible has much to say about HOPE.

"You will have courage because you have HOPE" (Job 11:18).

...and even when you don't feel hopeful..... call on the One who does.

"The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God, is my rock, in whom I take refuge.

He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold".

(Psalm 18:2)

So regardless of your circumstances, keep your HOPE alive today by staying focused on God. We must be careful not to get too attached to what we have around us because they are temporary!

"those who use the things of the world, as if not engrossed in them. For this world in its present form is passing away". (1 Cor 7:31)


"Be strong, and take heart, all you who HOPE in the Lord".

1: What enables you to hold onto Hope?


2: Have there been times in your life when it has been very difficult to be hopeful?
